#### From Pastor Bill

Christmas is the favorite season of the year for many. But I suspect that our love for Christmas causes us to overlook the brilliance of the season of Advent.

Advent is the season of waiting, anticipating, and longing. It is a season that takes us to the dark and asks us to linger in the dark for a while. It is a season that recognizes that life isn't all that it could be or should be. But we as Americans don't like to linger in the dark. We don't like it when all the loose ends aren't tied together. We would rather not have to wait. We want what we want when we want it. We are miserably uncomfortable with longing.

Yet the truth is that food tastes much better when we are hungry, that light only makes sense when there is darkness, that waiting actually makes the arrival even more exciting.

I am convinced that we as a culture suffer deeply from our unwillingness to practice Advent. We suffer from our unwillingness to pause, to reflect, to go deeper. We have a shallow political culture these days in part because few people want to take the time to go deeper. We would rather throw around memes, tweets, cliches, ideas wrapped up in short sentences that seldom capture the complexity of life. Elections are often won and lost these days on the basis of simplistic, black and white thought, buoyed up by horrible commercials that ask us to put our brains on hold.

Advent begs us to move beyond the simplistic, beyond our tendency to create either/or universes, beyond a belief that life is lived best when we don't long, but we simply have.

Richard Rohr says that one of the great prayers of Advent is "Come, O Sapientia. Come, O wisdom." And for Rohr that is a matter of inviting us into a "bigger mind."

Can I invite you into the practice of Advent this year? Don't be in a hurry to move into Christmas. Pause. Meditate. Identify your longings, your grief, your awareness of your brokenness. Sit with them for a while. Welcome the bigger mind. The small mind often doesn't serve us well. First Lutheran Church

#### From Pastoral Assistant Paula

The month of December ushers in the season of Advent and marks the beginning of the Christian calendar. It's about 22-28 days - depending on the year. I was not raised in the Advent 'atmosphere' but my mom did an excellent job of making sure I knew the *reason for the season*. The busyness leading up to the birth of the Christchild generated wonder and excitement and before I knew it, I was singing Silent Night and Joy to the World. I am grateful for those memories. But today, as a Lutheran and leader in an ELCA church, the season of Advent weighs heavy on my heart, this year more than others. Advent, you see, calls us to live in the tension between the 'already' and the 'not yet.' It's that season where we hold on to the fragile hope that everything broken will be made whole, that every sorrow will find joy, and that every deep longing will be met with love. It's about sitting with the messiness of life while holding onto the promise of what's to come.

This year has had a lot of messiness and brokenness. War in Ukraine, Gaza and the Middle East as a whole, occupation in the West Bank, war in Sudan and Ukraine, a contentious political atmosphere and a divided nation, systemic poverty, injustice and racism - all stark reminders that the world is not right. But Advent gives us permission to tell the truth, to see the world as it really is *and* to envision a future where everything is made right - the restoration of all things; where everything broken will be made whole and everything empty and devoid of love will be filled. In other words, Advent is a season of waiting in the already-and-not-yet that we live in. Biblical prophets like Jeremiah, never shied away from hard truths. Jeremiah noticed the ways that the world was not as it would be, not as it *should* be. He saw the world through heartache and tears, yet he saw something beyond the pain, suffering and brokenness:

""Watch for this: The time is coming'—God's Decree—'when I will keep the promise I made to the families of Israel and Judah. When that time comes, I will make a fresh and true shoot sprout from the David-Tree. He will run this country honestly and fairly. He will set things right. That's when Judah will be secure and Jerusalem live in safety. The motto for the city will be, "God Has Set Things Right for Us."

Jeremiah 33:14-16 (MSG)

Living in the hope and promise of Jesus, who embodies the compassion, restoration and justice we so long for is not easy. I am not good at waiting. Kate Bowler says we begin Advent by waiting...*tired* waiting. That's how I feel today. Tired. Tired of watching children die before they even have a chance to live; tired of injustice and vindictive words; tired of watching creation buckle under the weight of irreverent stewardship. But that's the practice of Advent...waiting for the day when the world will be made right and embracing Advent and Christmas as they truly are—imperfect, beautiful and real. I invite you this year to *watch* with me, and *wait* with me and *weep* with me until we get a glimpse of the baby; until we get a glimpse of peace, healing, grace, goodness and mercy. A glimpse of a weary world on the verge of rejoicing.
